

A new chapter is being written for this series with the arrival of screenwriter Jérémie Guez, whose experience in writing and directing for literature (Balancé dans les cordes), cinema (*Yves Saint Laurent, Boite Noire, Tigres et Hyènes*) and television (*BRI*) blends perfectly with the codes of the adventures of the billionaire in sneakers. In this diptych, intimate moral questions rub shoulders with the most pressing contemporary ethical issues, from Largo's secret family island in the Adriatic Sea to Benares via Ikeja in Nigeria...



Since volume 22, Francq has been using a different graphic approach, producing pencil sketches on paper before inking his pages digitally. The gallery is showing the original graphite plates, in other words, the penultimate stage of the creative process, and so enabling viewers to appreciate the original pencil marks no longer visible in the book itself. This is the first time that these exceptional artworks will have been shown to the public, and they give us precious insights into Francq's approach to framing his images, his choice of composition, positioning of speech bubbles, use of two-dimensionality to represent a particular scene, the balanced dynamism of his images, and his search for the perfect line.






This book has been printed in a limited edition of 320 copies, including 100 copies numbered from 1 to 100, accompanied by one of the artist's original drawings published in this edition, and 50 copies numbered from 1 to L, accompanied by an ex-libris signed and numbered by the artist.

Biography

Philippe Francq was born in Etterbeek on December 13, 1961. After an uneventful school career, he decided to complete his secondary education in an arts program and enrolled at Saint-Luc in September 1978.

It was there that he truly learned how to hold a pencil and fill a page. In 1981, he re-enrolled for three years in the comic book section, headed at the time by Claude Renard. In addition to the problem of drawing, he now had the more serious problem of writing the script.

At the age of 23, he left Saint-Luc with a string of diplomas and set out in search of both a publisher and inspiration. He worked successively with Gabrielle Borille, a scriptwriter with whom he produced the first ten pages of a story that would never see the light of day, and with Bob de Moor at Studio Hergé.

Bob de Groot offered him the chance to work with him on a series called *Des villes et des femmes*, and they produced two albums for Dargaud. Francq then published two volumes of Léo Tomasini, written by Francis Delvaux, with the same publisher.

His meeting with Jean Van Hamme in 1988 changed his destiny. The writer and screenwriter asked him to illustrate the adaptations he planned to make of a series of six novels that had earned him critical acclaim at Mercure de France in his early days.

Largo Winch is a series of modern thrillers, often exotic and always set in the world of high finance. The work was initially far ahead of its time and received fairly mediocre distribution. Francq's precise and effective drawings would place it among the absolute bestsellers of comic books.

Launched in the *Repérages* collection, the first volume sold over 50,000 copies upon its release, and the tenth would sell close to 500,000. At the same time, the novels were reissued in various forms, while a major 39-episode television series was broadcast around the world.

Philippe Francq and Jean Van Hamme were awarded the 2007 Sanglier for best adult album (one of the Uderzo Prizes) for *Les trois yeux des gardiens du Tao*, the 15th album in their Largo Winch series.

In 2017, Philippe Francq teamed up with the series' new scriptwriter, Eric Giacometti. Together, they wrote volumes 21 to 24 of Largo Winch.

In 2025, Jérémie Guez joined the team as scriptwriter, bringing with him a wealth of experience in writing and directing for literature (*Balancé dans les cordes*), cinema (*Yves Saint Laurent, Boite Noire, Tigres et Hyènes*) and television (*BRI*), which fits in perfectly with the adventures of the billionaire in sneakers.
